# Approval of minutes from 2003 business meeting

Linda Bireley moved to accept the minutes Seconded by Mark Collins (SC DNR) No discussion Vote- unanimously passed!

**Hutton Program update**- Christine reported on the Hutton program and its successes. It has grown every year: Yr 2003- 203; Yr 2004- 328 applicants. Diversity of applicants including from Mexico. Hutton committee reviewing policies- makes sure policy is consistent. Made a pitch to get involved in mentoring! Surveyed the 2001 class and found that more students are going into marine fisheries.

## President's Report (Mary Fabrizio)

Presented highlights of the Governing board meeting

- Strategic plan for 2005-09 was approved
- Approved- executive officers able to approve expenditures of \$5K or less. If expenditure is less than\$10K, management committee has authority to approval

Governing Board Retreat – discussed North American Agenda for Aquatic Resources and developed goals for each action item. Habitat issues were prominent.

## 2004-05 Program of work

# Symposium for 2005 annual meeting

- Stated that the next meeting will be Anchorage and that MFS needs a strong showing
- John provided a little history of MFS symposium sponsorship at AFS
- Solicited membership for symposium ideas
- Christine stated that the process to submit symposium ideas has been pushed back to mid-March for next year.
- Emory Andersen stated that on alternate years NMFS and Sea Grant have co-sponsored assigned symposia at the meetings. "Cooperative research and management" is scheduled for 2005 meeting. Often publishing proceedings. Asked if MFS is interested

in contributing towards sponsorship of symposium. Steering committee meeting after MFS meeting, all invited. Often a 1.5 day symposium.

- *Motion* Rubec motioned for MFS to co-sponsor next year's symposium. Linda Bireley 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- Discussion- Benefits to section? Short funding for sponsoring. John mentioned that there is no dollar amount on the floor from the motion.
- Typical budget for NMFS-SG symposium is \$160-\$170k. Supporting this symposium does not limit MFS from sponsoring another symposium. Limited only by treasury funds
- Does MFS want to contribute towards the symposium?
- Restructure related to marine fisheries?
- Emory- Focus is on marine fisheries.
- What is the definition of "cooperative research"?
- Emory- Constituents (eg fishing industry) working with agencies.
- Linda Bireley Does it make sense for the MFS to sponsor travel for one of the speakers (amendment to the motion?). Rubec liked idea.
- Amendment to the motion by Linda MFS sponsors travel of one of the invited speakers up to \$1000. Rubec 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion.
- Emory- Would rather see all of the money thrown into a single pot.
- Amendment to amendment- Move that we amend the amendment for MFS to contribute \$500 to co-sponsor.
- 1st Linda, 2<sup>nd</sup> Rubec.
- Further discussion- rather have money go to student travel. If it goes into a pot, lose control of money. Don't lose control if you choose someone to represent MFS on the steering committee.
- Emory- there is an invitation for all co-sponsors to be on the steering committee

# Motion- MFS will provide \$500 to co-sponsor symposium at Anchorage meeting-

Suggest estuarine section co-sponsor with MFS a social. Joint social at Anchorage.

Need to be careful on the message sent out by proving a social. Suggest leaving it to the EXOM committee.
